All of these switches have the same networking chip




Networking Hardware is a Commodity


Broadcom dominates the silicon market (think Intel x86)

• Currently used by all major ToR switches


OEM Manufacturers build systems based on Broadcom design

OpenFlow Deployments Today


- SDN is doing extremely well
